1) S + V + O (SはVする、 Oに対して)

例 She developed an operating system for the computer.

例 I like whiskey.

I'd like more hot water for the tea.

She enjoys studying statistics.

I'll read the book carefully.

He likes talking(to talk) with his boss.

I ate Katsudon for lunch.

He uses a special tool for repairing this machine.

He can eat Soba with chopsticks.

He can drink beer from the glass without touching it.

2) S + V + C (SはCです。 / SはCのようです。)

例 He looks smart.

例 I'm a lawyer.

例 He became an engineer.

This tea tastes funny to me.

The chairs got wet from sitting out in the rain.

The story sounds too ridiculous to believe.

You'll be comfortable here soon.

He's single/married.

He's interested in how ABC company considers the product.

3) S + V (SはVする。)

例 I've been to the Kanagawa factory.

例 He is working hard to pay the debt.

I drove to work today.

She sometimes jogs in the park with her dog.

He never works overtime even when everybody does.

He is talking on the other line at the moment, may I take a message?

My wife didn't talk to me this morning, actually she didn't even look at me.

4) S + V + O + O (~に~を与える。)

例 He gave me a car.

This problem gives me a headache.

I'll buy you a beer tonight.

I'm afraid I told your boss the true story.

He gave me a helpful direction to the zoo.

I'll cook you something spicy tonight.

Let me get you something cold to drink.

5) S + V + O + C (OをCにする。)

例 My job makes me happy.

I would like my steak medium done.

I'll keep you posted on that matter.

I didn't want to make my boss angry.

The document made me believe that he was a real lawyer.

I find the problem difficult to solve.

Don't consider him a reliable worker.

I usually leave my boss alone when he is in a bad mood.

She had her car repaired at that gas station.

I'll have my lawyer deal with the case, so please talk to my lawyer directly if you have anything.

The speaker made clear the point that was the main concern.

used to- He used to play tennis every weekend.

try to - Please try to understand what I am saying.

want to/would like to - I want to study English.

had better - You'd better catch the 8:31 train.

have to/had to- I have to finish this by 9:00.

can/be able to- I can reach the ceiling.

will - I'll use this machine to cut the metal.

shall - Shall we go eat now?

can/could - Can I use this computer?

may/might - May I help you?

must - You must not go there alone.

should/should have

- I should have bought the computer before it was gone.

can/could/could have

- These types of printers can be expensive in some stores.

may/might/might have

- I might have read about this before.

must/must have

- He must have been her secretary.

- 現在形 I work with Mr.Smith everyday.

- 現在進行形 I'm working with Mr.Smith now.

- 過去形 I worked with Mr.Smith, yesterday.

- 未来形 I'll work with Mr.Smith, tomorrow.

- 現在完了形 I've worked with Mr.Smith before.
